

There were 11 persons in attendance, with 4 apologies for absence.

1) Cliveden Cross Country - Sunday 30 December - Bob Lewer reported that entries are now in excess of 300 and the maximum of 400 should be reached very shortly. The course will be very much as last year, with some re-routing at the start and finish to protect the grass. A working party will carrying out clearance work on the course on Saturday 15 December.

- 2. Cherry Orchard a letter has been received from Burnham Parish Council stating that we should be prepared to raise £46,500 for a clubroom if called upon to do so by the Parish Council. Discussion took place on possible sources of funding.
- 3. London Marathon Entries proposals were put forward regarding the allocation of the two London Marathon places awarded to the club. After much discussion a proposal was carried that places should be allocated by ballot (to be eligible one must be a genuine 'reject' and a fully paid up member of at least one year's standing).
- 4. Sunday Times Fun Run Certificates have not yet been awarded as we have not had a Social since their receipt they will be distributed at the earliest opportunity.
- 5. Junior Joggers the race planned for Saturday 15 December has now been postponed until a Sunday in January.
- 6. Chiltern League Cross Country it was felt that a competitive spirit should be fostered at all times and that we should make every attempt to reach the First Division - even if it might mean relegation next season!

The lack of privacy and general condition of the Ladies Changing Room is still causing a lot of concern. Our representative on the Haymill Users Committee is be given full details of the problems experienced.

It was reported that yet again club members have been racing using another's number. Such practice is strictly against club policy.

Today's Runner Cross Country League - more ladies are needed to take part in races - all abilities very welcome.

Praise was given to all who helped organise and marshal the Burnham Beeches Cross Country last weekend.
